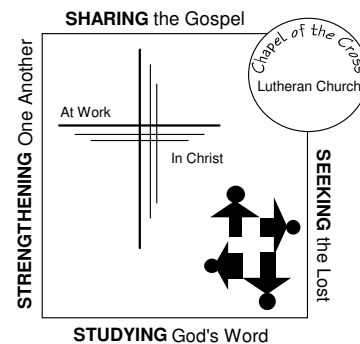

Sun: We invite you to join us for our Sunday School opening in the Gym at 9:25 a.m. each Sunday. Here we sing a kid friendly song, hear about the lesson that the kids will be learning about, and recognize birthdays. This year all 5th-12th graders are also encouraged to participate in the youth choir at this same time before class starts with Pastor Clausing and his guitar. THRIVENT FINANCIAL FOR LUTHERANS

Thrivent has made some changes for this year. Churches do not receive funds from headquarters anymore. Also, there are no congregational coordinators; we now have congregational advocates.

Thrivent has a new program called Choice Dollars. As a fraternal benefit society, the funds Thrivent Financial for Lutherans dedicates to charitable programs such as Thrivent Choice come from the sales of fraternal benefit society products (i.e. most Thrivent Financial life insurance, disability income insurance, annuities, etc.) Consequently, these are the types of products that qualify for Choice Dollars. Products issued through our subsidiaries do not contribute to the fraternal benefit. And in turn, do not qualify. Benefit members who are eligible to help direct Choice Dollars (based on their level of ownership of qualifying products or through volunteer leadership) should have received a letter by now giving the approximate designated Choice Dollars for 2010 and information on how to direct those dollars by calling 1-800-847-4836; say Thrivent Choice or by visiting www.thrivent.com/thriventchoice. Directing Choice Dollars online will require members to register on thrivent.com and set up a User ID and Password.

Adult benefit members will be eligible to direct Choice Dollars if they meet one or more of the following:

- Have \$800 or more in annual premiums of qualifying insurance products
- Have \$20,000 or more in contract value on qualifying products
- Hold a qualifying Thrivent Financial volunteer leadership position.

Chapel of the Cross is registered with Thrivent. When you contact Thrivent, you can select Chapel to receive your Choice Dollars. This could help with furnishing the new addition.

The election for the Central St. Charles County Board will be held on October 31, 2010.
