

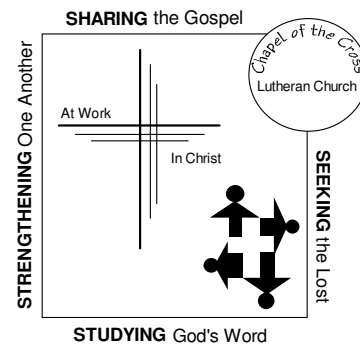

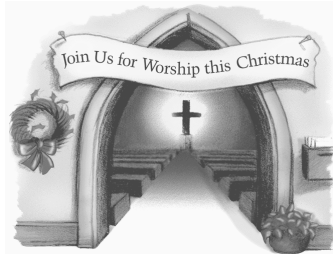

HELP FOR HONDURAS—Children's Shoes

Greetings to all, I am involved with a non-profit organization that sponsors an elementary school in Honduras with 125 children in grades 1 thru 8. This organization supplies one meal per day to these children and for some, that is the only food that they receive. Each year in January, we go down there and build a home for one family on the mountain and we also take clothing and other essential goods to distribute to the families. We are short on shoes for them and are in need of children's shoes (sneakers or tennis type shoes, no winter boots please) in sizes 13 1/2 to size 7, new or used (in good condition). I am also collecting bandaids, bandages and other first aid materials to take down there with me. This will be my 5th trip down there and I know what these shoes and other things mean to them. They do not have food banks, churches or others to help them. Most families live on dirt floors. If you are moved to help, Thank You, and if you cannot help, Thank You also.
