### **VOTER'S MEETING WRAP-UP FROM SEPTEMBER 14, 2014**

- **Call of Pastor Prince**—The vote to call Pastor Prince was unanimous. Pastor Prince will be serving as a worker-priest. A worker-priest is a person who has a full time job outside the church, but is still a called and ordained minister. Pastor Prince will continue to work with the confirmation program, Sunday School program, and will also occasionally lead the service and preach.
- **District Status**—After much deliberation, the congregation voted unanimously to request the transfer of the church's membership from the English District to the Missouri District. This transfer works in much the same way individuals or families transfer from one LCMS congregation to another. Chapel remains a part of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod on a denominational level, while working under the Missouri District on a regional level.
- **Constitution**—The vote to update the church's constitution passed as well. The new constitution streamlines the structure and governance of the church. If you would like to read the new constitution in full, please stop by the office and you can have a copy to read at your leisure.
